Our focus this half term is evolution and inheritance. We will be looking at how living things have changed and evolved over time and how fossils provide us with information about the past. We will find out how animals have adapted to their environment and research and natural and artificial selection.

Geography/History

We will use maps to locate parts of America and the southern and northern hemispheres. We will compare the Galapagos Islands to the UK in terms of the physical and human aspects and plot the route taken by HMS Beagle. We will be researching animals that live on the Galapagos Islands and look at how they have adapted to their environment. We will find out about significant individuals from the past, Charles Darwin and Mary Anning.

Music

This term we will look at soul and pop music. The children will explore pulse, rhythm, pitch, tempo and dynamics within the social question 'How does music bring us together?'

RE

Our question this half term is 'Why do some people believe in God and others don't believe?' We will have the opportunity to find out different views, and to express thoughtful ideas about atheism, agnosticism and religious views about God. This connects with our Science topic, asking questions about the start of life on our planet.'

Art

Darwin and his contemporaries made detailed observational drawings of the variety of life. We will explore different techniques e.g. hatching, stippling and shading, as we draw objects from nature.

PSHE

The focus this half term is 'Drug Education.' We will identify different drugs and assess some of the risks and effects. We will discuss influences and when these may become pressures. The learning will also look at how we can ask for help and basic emergency procedures.

P.E. is on Wednesday afternoons. This half term we will focus on football and Tag Rugby. Year 6 pupils will be dismissed from the Leisure Centre at 3:15pm.
