The Tudor Period




English

Our focus will be on writing persuasive letters. We will look at the elements that make up persuasive writing.

Grammar will focus on: hyphens, subjunctive form, subordinating clauses and conjunctions, colons and semi-colons, passive and active voice and subject verb agreement. We will continue to practice spelling homophones, as well as revisiting a number of spelling conventions previously taught over Key Stage 2.

History

We will be finding out about the Tudor period in Britain. We will look at a number of key events, such as: the Battle of Bosworth; the establishment of the Church of England; and what befell Henry VIII's six wives!

Also, as part of our learning we will look at where the Tudor period fits in to our wider historical knowledge, explore Tudor punishments and see who inherited the crown after Henry VIII, and the danger and plotting that lurked around every corner, for both the monarch and any would-be successor!

RE

The big question this half term is... 'What do Christians believe that Jesus did to 'save' people?' We will be looking at where 'Salvation' fits in to the Bible's big story and discuss how important and impactful sacrifice is in today's society.

PSHE

This half term we will continue to look at 'Does Money Matter?'. We will be exploring how finance plays an important part in people's lives and develop an understanding of loans, debt, tax and interest.

Music

This half term, it will be all about form. Clay will be used to create a Tudor Rose. We will also experiment with ink and wash as we make observations of rose petals.
