



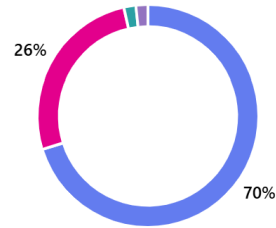
## Annual Questionnaire Results 2025

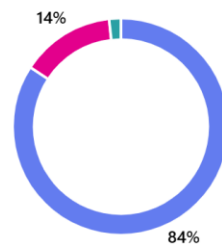

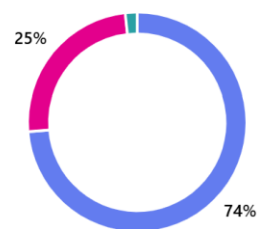

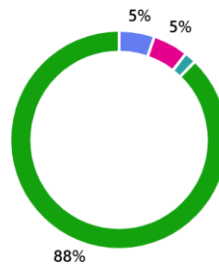

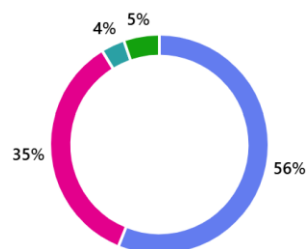

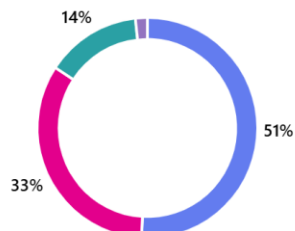

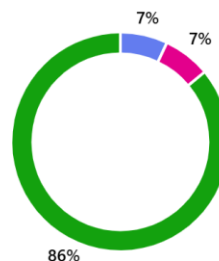

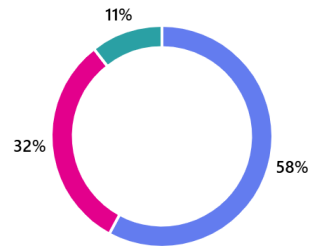

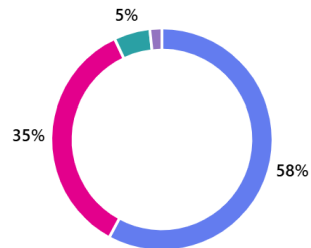

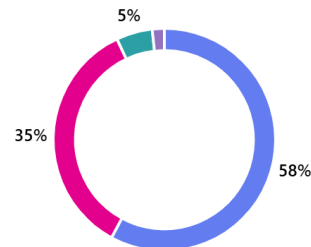

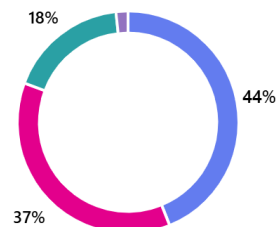

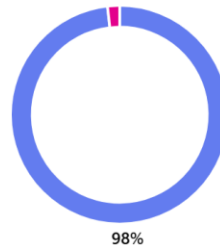

1	anonymous	Keep going as you are all doing a wonderful job! Thank you for giving my child the strong start that we could only have hoped for.
2	anonymous	You are a brilliant school and I am lucky to have my children attend. Thankyou for everything you do
3	anonymous	Lovely school, teachers are always on hand for support. I always feel aware of what my children are learning and trust the teachers will help where they are struggling. Homework isn't too much for them, my youngest enjoys her homework like her older brother and sister. Love how they do swimming lessons and the extras such as the history van. I love how we get to join in with services at church and we get the choice to do home crafts for projects for school.
4	anonymous	Have separate appointments for separated parents at parents evening not all separated parents get on well enough so sit next to each other. And because of the one appointment only I have never attended Scarlettes parents evening

5	anonymous	Only criticism would be if a parent/child states no to an activity, an email querying affordability is not necessarily appropriate. Nor is questioning the child individually about why they do not want to take part. Parents and children should not have to justify why an extra activity/trip is not for them.

11	anonymous	Great that there is more extra curricular activities. Most are based on music or performance. It would be good if there was something stem focused like lego club or science etc. Music or performance are not in my child's interests.
12	anonymous	I want to stress we are really happy with the school and both of my children love attending here, but there are three minor things I think could be changed to improve it. Firstly, I would really like to be informed more about my child's progress. Currently we are just informed about whether they are on track to meet expectations for the year, but are not told what those expectations are, or how close they are to meeting those expectations. I know, for example, that students are expected to achieve a score of 100 in ks2 reading, but this translates to roughly an expected grade 4 or 5 at GCSE. If my child is capable of achieving higher grades I would like to know this, so I can support them more and offer earlier intervention if needed. I also think the after school evening owls could be improved, as the provision is quite basic (just some toys left out and some snacks) and my children get quite upset about having to go because they find it quite boring. In contrast, some of my friends' children from other schools their after school provision because the staff there make an effort to play with the kids, and do group games and crafts with them instead of just supervising them. Finally, the last point is very minor but one of the things that irritates me the most as a secondary school teacher is students coming to school unorganised and without the correct pens and equipment. In year 5 my daughter was expected to provide her own pencil case, but now she is in year 6 she is not allowed and I feel this is a real missed opportunity to help her become a little more responsible and independent and generally just ready for secondary school.
13	anonymous	Would like after school club on a Thursday or Friday. Perhaps a karate club?, movie club, cooking club/ youth club or teaming up with another school Primary stars said the cost of the hall hire was too much not the uptake. When in juniors independence is encouraged but a gentle reminder with things like homework/ taking bits home I think should be maintained.

15	anonymous	If a child is struggling in a particular area i.e Maths rather than wait until parents evening to inform on the particular area why is the school book not sent back that week to recap at home. By the time it is reported home there is no time to support recovery at home in the term.

Not receiving a license is demoralising and demotivating and can have lasting effects on a child's development. 2, More opportunities for competitive sports, competing across the county like the school used to offer. 3, increase the availability of opting in for different lunches, we know the menu in advance as its on 'Parent Pay' lots of other schools do this, parents can select the days their children can have school dinners or packed lunches in advance. 4, I Understand the school is focused on supporting children's MH&W, integrating it into the curriculum and fostering a positive school environment is great. I would however, recommend bringing back 'Well being Wednesday' this is on the school website but my child has expressed this doesn't happen anymore and seems it needs updating with current initiatives.
