

Maths

Addition and Subtraction

- Number bonds to 10 and 100.
- Add 1-digit and 2-digit numbers together.
- 10 more and 10 less.
- Number problems and sentences.

Place Value

- Recognising tens and ones.
- Writing numbers in words and numerals.
- Counting in 2's, 3's, 5's and 10's.
- Comparing objects and numbers.

English

This half term we will be focusing our learning on Robin Hood and changing the tale to make it our own. The children will also learn about the features of a non-chronological report and will then write their own based on their visit to Warwick Castle. Additionally, the children will become more familiar with a range of chants and songs.

History

In History we will learn about the purpose of castles and who built them. We will also be identifying the different features of a medieval castle and their uses as well as understanding what daily life in a castle was like.

PSHE

In PSHE the children this half term will explore the topic 'drug education'. They will gauge an understanding the importance of physical, emotional and mental health. Additionally, the children will learn about which drugs are the most dangerous.

Geography

In Geography the children will explore a range of amazing structures around the world and locate them on a world map. They will also then compare famous structures from around the world using aerial photographs.

Art

In art children will be taking rubbings of different surfaces and textures around the school including, but not limited to, brick, wood, tarmac. They will also use a range of materials such as pasta and cotton wool to further discover printing. The children will design and print a castle using a range of textures, shape, line and pattern.

PE

Our PE this half term will be based on gymnastics. The children will develop their gymnastic skills of rolling in a variety of ways. Children will develop body tension, control and balance when performing their gymnastic sequence on the floor an apparatus.

Religious Education

Key Question- What does it mean to be a Muslim in Britain today? Children will begin to describe, explain and analyse beliefs and practices, recognising the diversity which exists within and between communities.

Design Technology

Children will complete a series of practical tasks in D&T including building a castle with mechanisms. The children will then investigate how these structures can be made stronger, stiffer and more stable.
