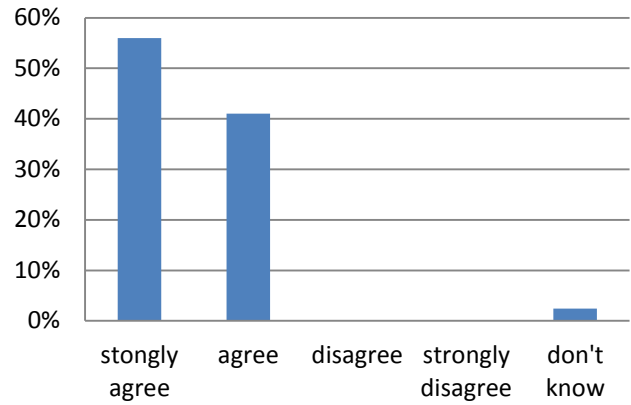
41 questionnaires were returned this is a 32.2% response rate



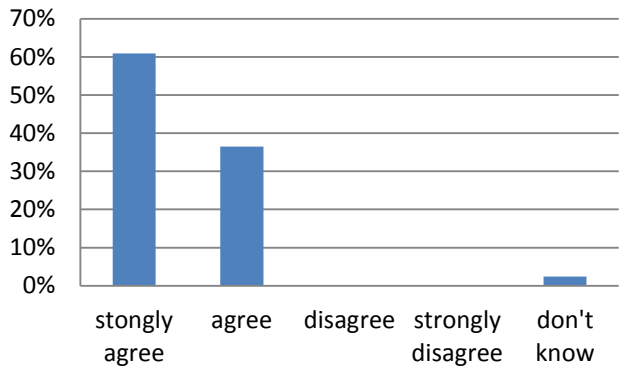

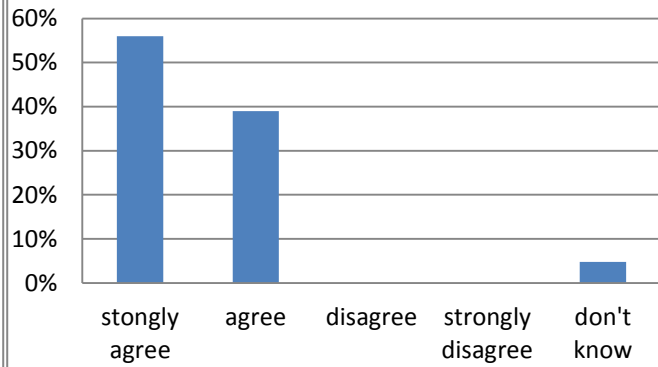
6. I receive information from the school about my childs progress



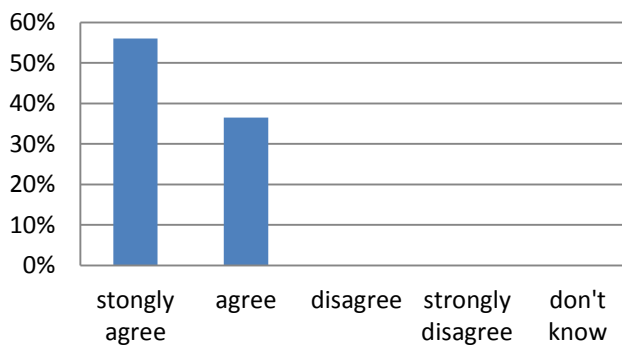
7. My child knows when their learning is good



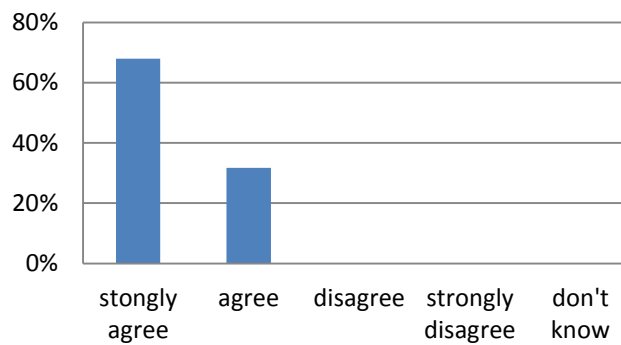
8. Other adults in the school help my child learn.



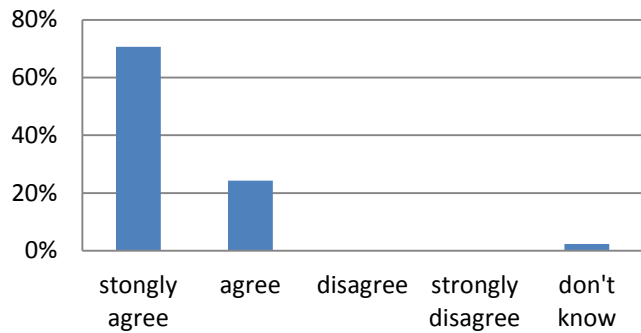
9. My child understands why they are learning.



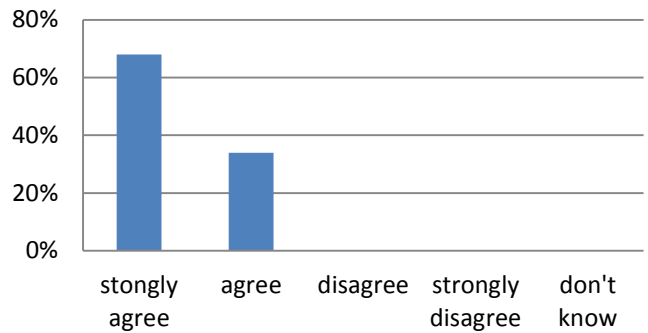
10. My child learns inside and outside school.



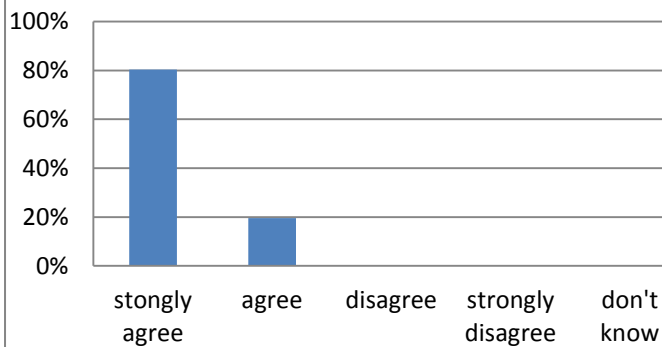

We have held independent reviews with a Peer review panel of architects in order to ensure that there are no hiccups or delays. The footpath has now had the agreement to be diverted therefore we can now get on with utilising our new space.

We try and offer a wide range of extra curricula activities. Members of the teaching staff run a number of these themselves and we also have outside providers in school to undertake other clubs. Running club is only offered to Junior children as we have to ensure ratios are correct and we take the children off the school site. We also run a fair distance continuously and we would be concerned about the stamina for the EYFS children if they were to take part- We run sports clubs every lunchtime led by the Sports Crew- Soccer stars and running/athletics club. Next term we will be starting Cricket and Netball club as well.

- *shelter to drop off and pick up*

- *Some sort of rain shelter would be nice!*

With the new building there will be areas which will offer cover.

- *My child would love to do more baking activities and newer reading books, some we have been given have had pages missing.*

- *Less emphasis on numeracy and literacy- allow kids to be kids, more emphasis on independent living skills*

- *Give assignment appropriate to the age of the children.*

- *Perhaps improve rewards?*

We will ask the children how they would like to improve the Reward system within school

- *Continue promoting music.*

There are extra curricula music activities- Guitar lessons, Piano lessons, 5 Music club for Junior aged children and the School Choir.*

- *Making sure plenty of notice given for trips, etc. continues and also a bit more time if pupils need to learn something off by heart as a week to learn something to recite seems a bit short.*

We will endeavour to ensure plenty of notice is given for trips and events and provide time for homework activities.

- *Perhaps a tiered system for morning clubs with different prices, etc...*

This can be taken to the Full Governing Board for discussion.

- The use of the leisure centre for sports was a great idea, if this could continue for all year groups.*

We are looking into the cost and feasibility of this for September 2018 onwards.
