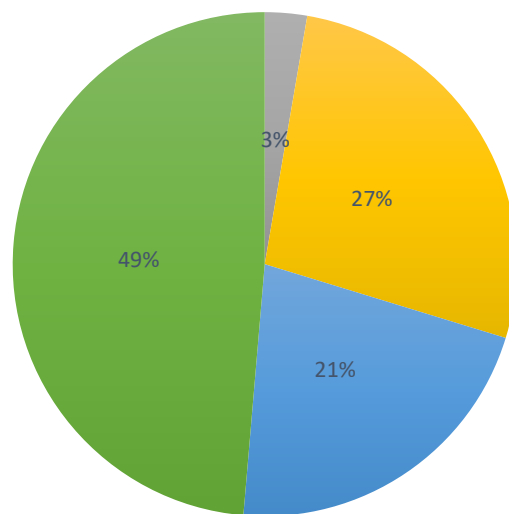


## September 2020 Return to School Survey

Responses received from 61 parents

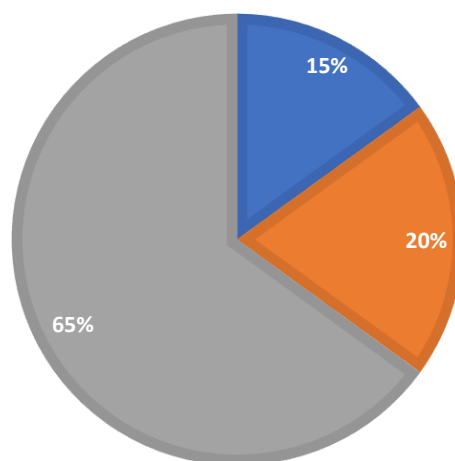
### When home schooling started how easy did you find it?



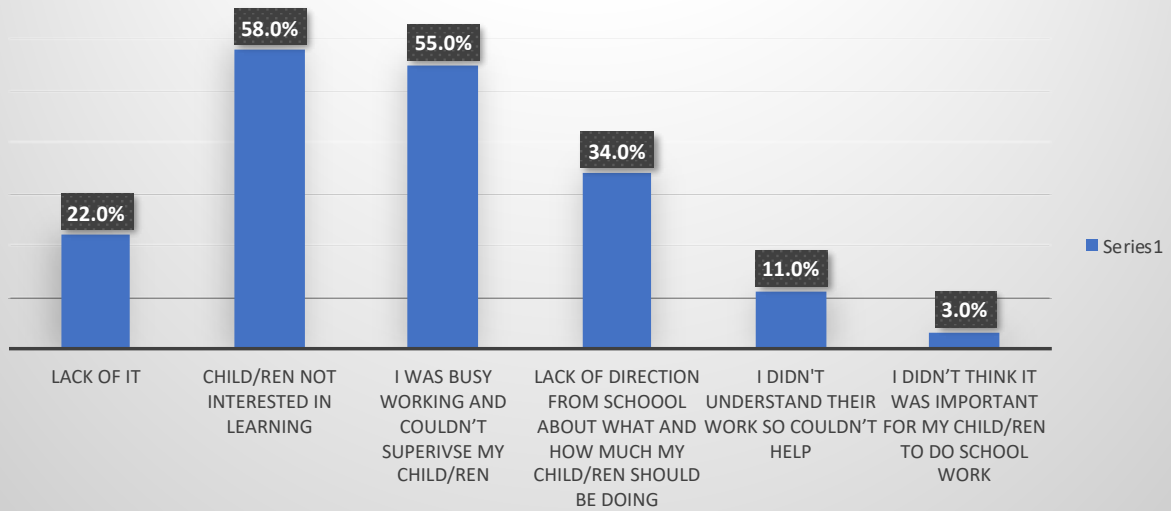
■ Very Easy ■ Easy ■ Neither easy nor difficult ■ Difficult

### How did this change over time?

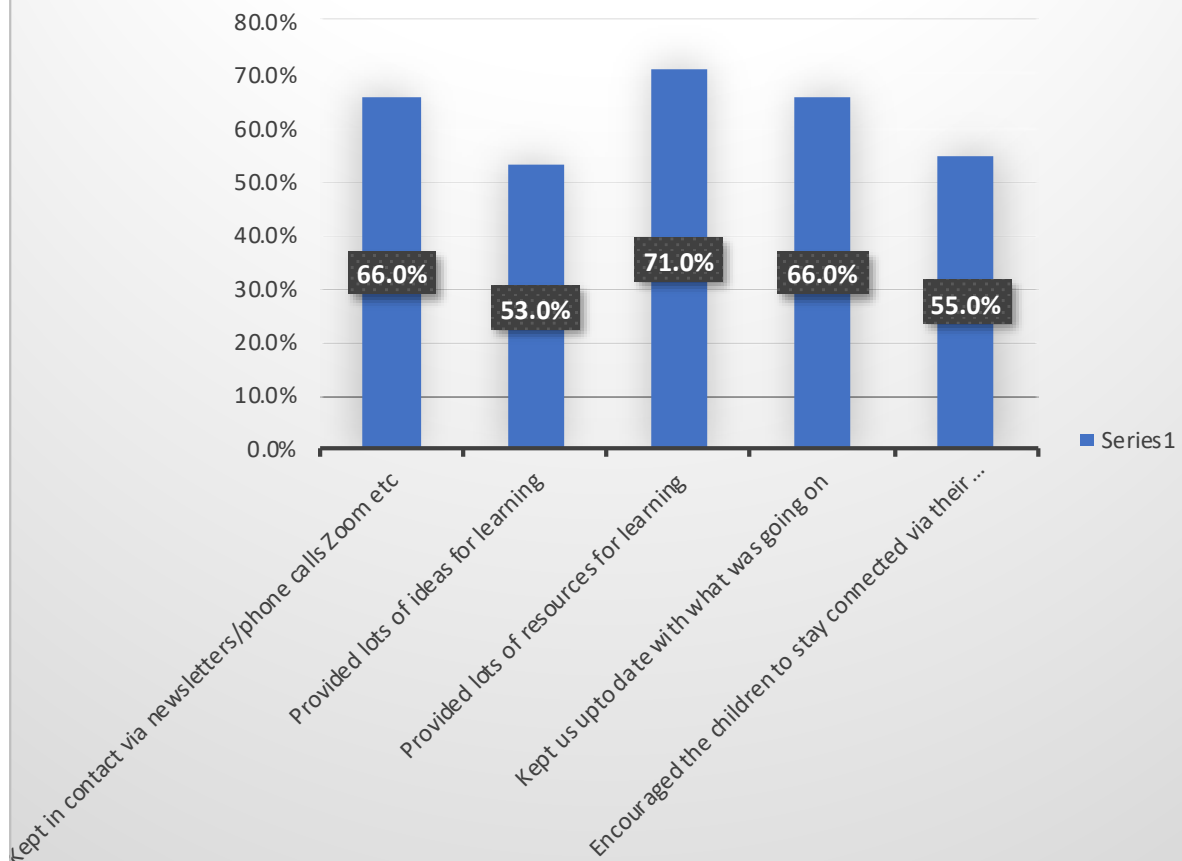
■ It became Easier ■ No change ■ It became harder



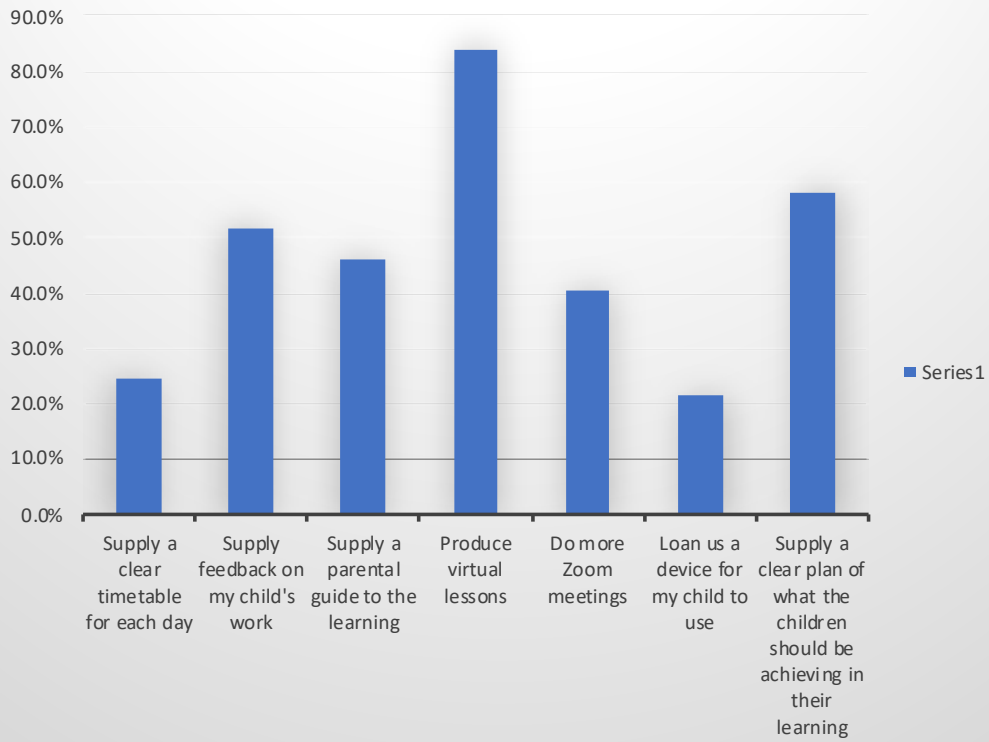
## What were the biggest challenges you faced with home schooling?



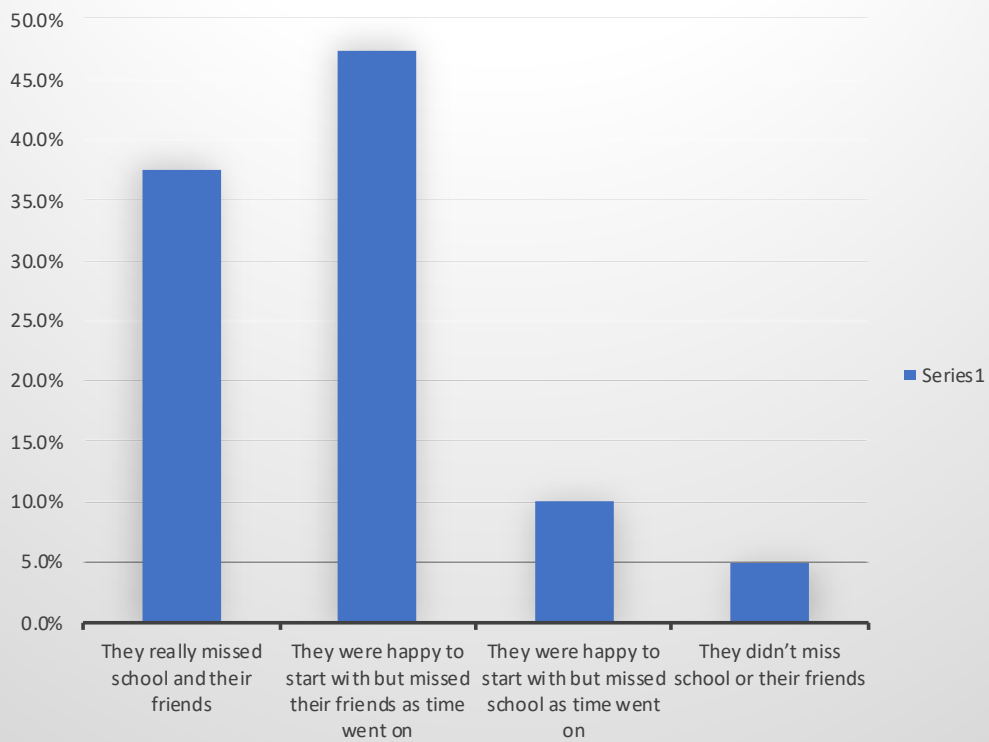
## What did the school do well to support home learning?



## What could the staff have done better to support home learning?

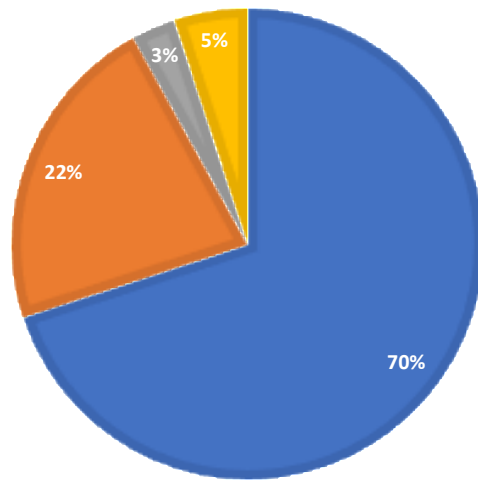


## How did your child/ren cope with not coming to school?



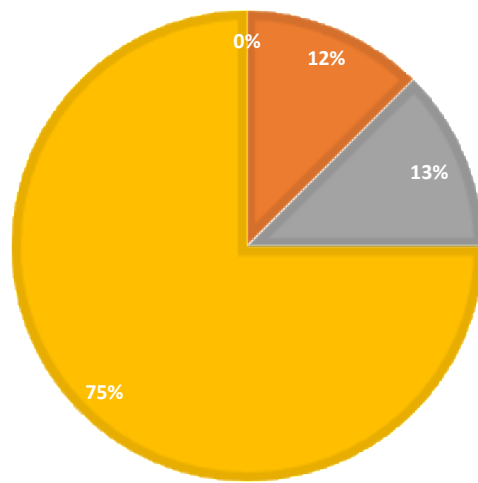
### How does your child feel about returning to school?

Home schooling is not possible when both parents work. My son would be fully motivated to do work if 1-1 time was given through a zoom meeting or even a socially distanced face to face meeting. He should be given clear targets of work for each week by the teacher and not the parents. Children will do what the teacher says when it comes to work.
